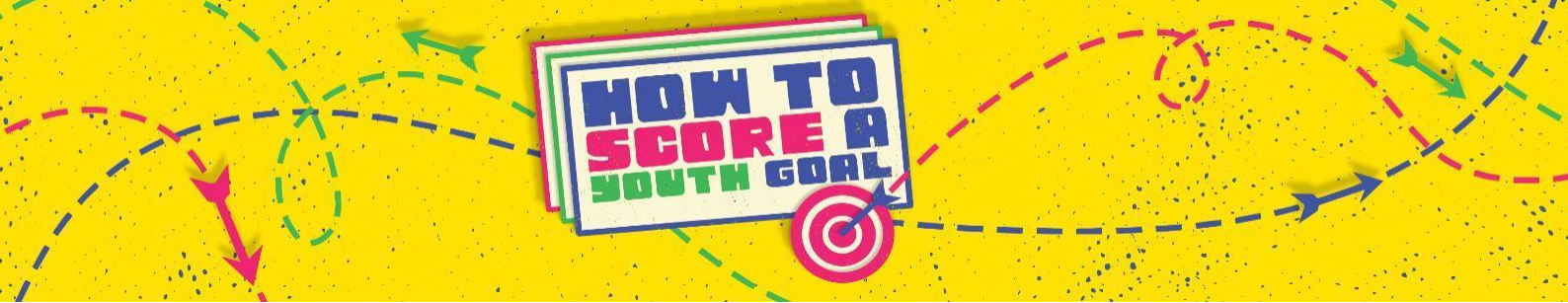

The German Federal Youth Council (DBJR) is calling for participants to apply to the last of four Learning, Training and Teaching Activities (LTTA) happening within the ERASMUS+ project “How to score a Youth Goal”.

The 4-Day training course “Youth Goals Training Camp” will be held in Berlin (Germany) from the 27th until 30th of October* and is organized by the DBJR. The Training will be held by a team of trainers coming from two project organizations: DYPALL and DBJR. It is mandatory for the participants to be present throughout the duration of the training (4 days).

*the training takes place for the entirety of the 4 days. Therefore the participants` arrival to Berlin is expected on the 26th of October and the departure is expected on the 31th of October.

Who is it for?

We`re looking for motivated youth ambassadors (young people between 18 and 30 years old who are engaged in the EU Youth Dialogue (e.g. as EU Youth Delegates) or want to get engaged) from ERASMUS+ programme countries with a good English level.

Context

The Youth Goals are the outcome of the Youth Dialogue process with over 50.000 young people. They represent views of young people from all over Europe and are part of the EU Youth Strategy.

The European Project “How to score a Youth Goal”, lead by a consortium of four National Youth Councils (Austria, Portugal, Germany and Croatia), which coordinate and implement the European Youth Dialogue in their countries, aims to encourage the participation of young people by promoting the implementation of the European Youth Goals. In order to transfer knowledge into implementation, a training curricula was designed and will be tested directly on people from NYCs, international non-governmental youth organizations, local and regional youth organizations, decision makers and policy makers.



Now it's time to test this curricula and get feedback on it! The opinions and suggestions of the participants in the training courses (LTTAs) will be taken seriously into account when the time comes for revising, supplementing and finalising the training curricula in order to achieve a higher level of quality!

What's in it for the participants?

The participants will

- Have an opportunity to gain/develop their skills such as networking, collaboration and advocacy
- Gain knowledge on models/mechanisms of youth participation and the policy dialogue in the field of youth and non-formal learning
- Get a chance to learn about the best practices on youth goal implementation in various EU countries
- Gain different skills useful for Youth Goals implementation
- Have an opportunity to spend 4 consecutive days in an international environment
- Paid travel, accommodation and food
- Enjoy Berlin in the free time! The training is right next to a lake in a very quiet and nature area. But city life's not far away, so there is something for everyone.

Objectives

The objective of European Youth Dialogue Ambassadors is to raise awareness and promote the implementation of the 11 European Youth Goals among young people across Europe. As ambassadors, their role is to encourage young people to participate in activities and initiatives that contribute to achieving these goals, and to advocate for the importance of youth involvement in shaping the future of Europe. They also work to ensure that the voices of young people are heard and represented in decision-making processes at the local and national levels.



The training course **“Youth Goals Training Camp”** has as main objective to support EUYD Ambassadors, to disseminate and to raise awareness about Youth Goals and, train EUYD Ambassadors in the basic principles and practices of Youth Goals, Youth Policies and Youth Participation so that they can act as ambassadors.

To achieve these goals, the training course **“Youth Goals Training Camp”** focuses on the following objectives:

- To develop a deep understanding of the 11 European Youth Goals and their importance for young people across Europe.
- To build the skills and knowledge necessary to effectively communicate and advocate for the goals to a wide range of audiences, including policymakers, civil society organizations, and young people themselves.
- To empower young people to take leadership roles and actively participate in shaping the future of Europe.
- To promote diversity, inclusion, and a sense of belonging among the ambassadors, and encouraging them to work together to achieve common goals.
- To develop the capacity of the ambassadors to plan and implement projects and activities that contribute to the achievement of the European Youth Goals.
- To build relationships and networks among the ambassadors, as well as with other organizations and individuals working to advance youth empowerment and the European Youth Goals.
- To enhance the digital skills of the ambassadors, including social media and other online communication tools, to effectively reach and engage with a diverse audience of young people across Europe.

The application deadline is: September 12th 2023



The organizer (DBJR) covers the cost of travel, accommodation and food.

If you can, travel green! Bicycle, public transport (train, bus, boat...), carpooling – it's up to you!

In case of travelling by plane, the organizer will also take care of buying the tickets, so please read the registration form carefully and don't buy the plane tickets by yourself.

Transportation by car is acceptable but only in the form of carpooling (car sharing). In this case, the organizer of the training course has to be notified about this type of travel and the people driving in the car(s) after which the organizer will or will not allow the carpooling as a means of travel.

Important: travelling by taxi, BlaBlaCar or some similar means of car transportation is not an acceptable cost.

As the number of participants in the training is limited, you will be notified up to 48h after application deadline if you have been accepted and you will then also receive all the necessary logistical and program details.
